

STUDENT PARKING PRIVILEGES

The Torrington Board of Education (the "Board") recognizes that parking on school property is a privilege afforded to students in high school. In order to facilitate the orderly operation of schools within the Torrington Public Schools (the "District"), certain conditions are attached to that privilege. Students who fail to comply with these conditions will be denied or subject to loss of parking privileges.

Students shall receive notice that vehicles parked on school property may be subject to search in accordance with Board policy 5191, School Searches, and appliable search and seizure laws. The District does not assume responsibility for any loss or damage to vehicles or their contents while they are on school property.

- 1. All students who wish to park on school property during school hours must obtain a permit from the school.
- 2. The administration annually determines the number of parking spaces on school property which can be made available to students.
- 3. Parking permits will only be issued to students with a valid driver's license.
- 4. Students and parents must submit a completed, signed application form for a student parking permit.
- 5. Seniors will have the first opportunity for available parking spaces in the parking lot.
- 6. All students must obey established traffic and parking rules.
- 7. Each student who receives a parking permit will be assigned a numbered parking space and may only park in the designated space.

- 8. Parking permits must be displayed at all times while on school property.
- 9. Parking permits may be revoked at any time at the discretion of the administration including for a violation of this policy.
- 10. Penalties for driving violations, parking without a permit, or other school violations may include suspension or revocation of the permit, disciplinary action, ticketing by the police and/or towing of the student's vehicle.
